The purpose of this document is to explain Angelo State University's (University) responsibilities under Title IX and the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), and to provide the rights and options available to students and employees who may have been a victim of sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, or stalking, whether the incident occurred on or off campus. In the event of a conflict between this document and applicable law, the law will prevail. A Complainant does not need to file a formal complaint to access support.

You have the option to report incidents of sexual misconduct to law enforcement will assist you with contacting law enforcement if you wish.

You may receive medical attention at any medical facility. All medical facilities are confidential and have no duty to report disclosed information to the University. However, certain facilities have staff that are specially trained to help survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault, such as Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) who can perform a Sexual Assault Forensic Exam (SAFE) to preserve forensic evidence, with or without police involvement.

If possible, evidence collection should be completed within approximately 120 hours of an assault. After 120 hours, it still may be helpful to receive medical attention. It is recommended that you preserve any evidence related to the incident, such as clothing, photographs, phone records, text messages, computer records, and other documents. Clothes, sheets, or towels should be placed in a paper (not plastic) bag.

Mutually understandable words or actions, actively communicated both knowingly and voluntarily, that clearly convey permission for a specific activity. Consent is not effective if it results from: (a) the use of physical force; (b) a threat of physical force; (c) intimidation; (d) coercion; (e) incapacitation; or (f) any other factor that would eliminate an individual's ability to exercise their own free will to choose whether or not to engage in sexual activity.
